In 1999, California enacted the California Uniform Electronic Transactions Act (CUETA) in Civil Code 1633.1 to give electronic signatures the same legal authority as "wet" signatures on contracts. An electronic signature is defined as an electronic sound, symbol or process that is attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record. All signatory parties of the contract must agree to use electronic signatures to execute the contract.
